## REFERENCING STANDARDS FOR COPYRIGHT MATERIAL CONTAINED IN COMPILATIONS, COURSE PACKS AND STUDY GUIDES

*Compilations, course notes and study guides must  
contain full bibliographical information for  
all copyright material copied*

The copying of extracts from another person's work is viewed seriously by tertiary educational institutions and academic staff are required to acknowledge and identify all copyright material used in compilations, course packs and study guides. This includes any illustrations or text taken from published works and included in overheads which may be contained in compilations, course packs and study guides.

Copyright Licensing Limited (CLL) provides a licence that allows licensed institutions to include extracts from published works (beyond the limits provided under the Copyright Act 1994) in compilations, course packs and study guides prepared for students. Full details of this material are necessary if copyright owners are to share in the distribution of licensing fees collected by CLL.

Where the material contained in compilations is produced internally and is not copied from a published work, then details are not required. Where the material is taken from journals, books and other published works, then full bibliographic detail and source data is required.

Academic staff should use similar standards to those required of students when providing source details of such material. The following guidelines can be used when identifying material copied or preparing a Reference List for the copyright material contained in compilations.

### ***Extracts from books:***

Author (Year). Name of Book, Place of publication, Publisher, First page - Last page

### ***Articles from journals/serials/magazines/newspapers:***

Author (Year, Publication date). Name of article. Name of Journal etc. Volume, First page - Last page

### ***Law reports:***

*Thornton Hall Mfg Limited v Shanton Apparel Limited* (1989) 3 NZLR 304 (CA)

### ***Legislation:***

Section 24(3) Copyright Act 1962 (if annotated include Publisher details)

Any categories of works not shown above should be recorded in a similar fashion.
